

Falco peregrinus Peregrine Falcon

World's largest urban population of nesting Peregrine falcons is in New York City. Typically they nest on tall buildings and bridges.

- 16 mating couples live in NYC
- 2 nesting sites located in proximity
- 1 nest located on Brooklyn Bridge

Myotis lucifugus Little Brown Bat

One of the most common bats of New York City that is being wiped out by white-nose syndrome. Typically live in tree hollows, rock crevices and bridges.



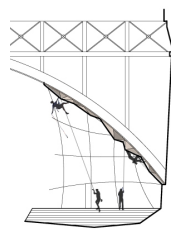
Danaus plexippus Monarch Butterfly

Manhattan offers an annual stop-over for butterflies migrating from Canada to Mexico.

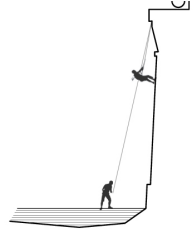


Apis mellifera Western Honey Bee

Bee-keeping was legalised in NYC in 2010.



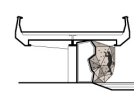
1 | OVERHEAD CLIMBING

EAST STREET ARCHWAY



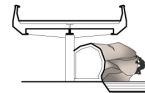
2 | RAPPELLING + BELAYING

MAIN BASTION



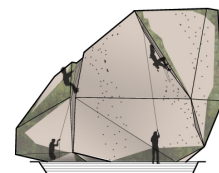
3 | TRADITIONAL CLIMBING
